## 2.1 Running D-Tale from an ipython notebook

### 2.1.1 Using a pandas.DataFrame or pandas.Series

The following is hopefully sufficient for most applications (feedback welcome!):

```
import dtale
dtale.show(df)
```

```
[1]: import dtale
import pandas as pd

def build_data():
    for i in range(100):
        rec = dict(date=pd.Timestamp('20000101'), security_id=i, foo=i, bar=1.2345678)
        for j in range(50):
            rec[str(j)] = j
        yield rec

df = pd.DataFrame(list(build_data())).set_index(['date', 'security_id'])

dtale.show(df)
```
